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Article Title: Large Lingual Tori: A Clinical Case Report

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Review Report

The article describes a clinical case of unilateral mandibular torus.

The text summarizes the most noteworthy aspects of this disorder and offers very interesting historical data. The clinical case is very well documented and the images are very demonstrative. However, the authors should clarify if this exostosis caused any type of pain or functional alteration to the patient. Taking into account that the lesion remained quiescent for the last four years, why was surgical intervention decided upon? It is not clear if this intervention was necessary or optional, if the disorder caused any symptoms, or if the removal was preventative for some reason. A brief commentary about the results that could be obtained through laser surgery in comparison with the technique employed by the authors could also be interesting. Apart from these unknown aspects, this paper is very well written and structured, presenting a peculiar and infrequent case of torus mandibular, which is of interest for the medical community's knowledge. Congratulations to the authors.
